SA Summer of Sail Regatta

29 – 30 January 2022

Organised and conducted by Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron (Organising Authority)
in conjunction with Down Under Sail (Event Host)

NOTICE OF RACE

[DP] Denotes a rule for which the penalty may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification. [NP] Denotes that a breach of this rule will not be grounds for protest by a boat.

1. Rules

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) that are current at the time of the beginning of the event.
- 1.2. The Special Regulations of Australian Sailing (AS) Part 2 will apply.
- 1.3. The sailing instructions will be made available on the official notice board and/or on the [SA Summer of Sail website](#).

2. Advertising

- 2.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. If this rule is broken. [DP][NP].

3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1. The regatta is open to all keel boats, OS multihulls, senior and junior off-the-beach monohulls, off-the-beach multihulls boats, sports boats, Sailability, kitefoilers and windsurfers, as well as additional classes upon request.
- 3.2. All competitors shall be members of a club affiliated with Australian Sailing or a World Sailing Member National Authority.
- 3.3. Eligible boats shall enter by completing the online entry process, available on the [SA Summer of Sail website](#) and paying the required fees by credit card. Entries shall be received up to midnight Friday 14 January 2022.
- 3.4. Entry may be accepted after Friday 14 January 2022 however a late fee will be incurred.

- 3.5. The Organising Authority may make alternate arrangements for a class if five (5) entries have not been received by midnight on Friday 14 January 2022 for that class. Competitors will be notified of new arrangements by email, text message, and/or via post on the official notice board. Advices may also be posted on the [SA Summer of Sail website](#). Please note: racing for any class will not be cancelled if it does not have a total of five (5) boats, however prizes may not be issued for that class.

4. Fees

- 4.1. The required fees (Inclusive of GST) are as follows:
 Keelboats, OS multihulls and sports boats - \$130 per boat (including GST)
 Double-handed OTB dinghies and multihulls - \$100 (including GST)
 Single-handed OTB dinghies and multihulls - \$70 (including GST)
 Optimist Green Fleet - \$50 (including GST)
 Kitefoilers - \$50 (including GST)
 Windsurfer LT - \$50 (including GST)
- 4.2. A late fee of \$30 for entering after Friday 14 January 2022 may apply.
- 4.3. If any entry is cancelled by the competitor, or the event is cancelled due to COVID-19 restrictions, before Saturday 1 January 2022, the entry fee will be refunded in full.
- 4.4. If any entry is cancelled by the competitor after Saturday 1 January 2022, the event may withhold up to 40% of the entry fee
- 4.5. If the event is cancelled due to COVID-19 restrictions after Saturday 1 January 2022, the event may withhold up to 20% of the entry fee

- 5.2. On the last day of racing, no warning signal will be made after 1600 hrs.
- 5.3. Race sessions will be set up in the morning and the afternoon to share resources across multiple classes. Classes will not race in more than one session per day.

6. Venue

- 6.1. The regatta venue is the Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron, Outer Harbour SA. The racing area will be on Gulf St Vincent or in the Port River.

7. The Courses

- 7.1. The courses will be described in the Sailing Instructions.

8. Scoring

- 8.1. A minimum of three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 8.2. When fewer than four (4) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 8.3. When four (4) races have been completed but less than nine (9) races, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her worst score.
- 8.4. When nine (9) races or more have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her two (2) worst scores.
- 8.5. Total races may differ between classes, with formats released as part of the Sailing Instructions.

9. Support Boats

- 9.1. Support boats shall register via email to info@sasummerofsail.com.au – Support boats are required to comply with local legislation.
- 9.2. All support boats must carry a working VHF radio, as well as be prepared to assist the race committee if requested to do so until cleared to leave the course area.

10. Prizes

- 10.1. Prizes shall be given as follows: 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class with ten or more boats. 1st for any class with less than ten (10) boats and at least five (5) boats.
- 10.2. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the event host

11. Disclaimer of Liability

- 11.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority will not accept, nor will the event host, any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

12. Insurance

- 12.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance including racing risk, with a minimum cover of \$5,000,000 (recommended \$10,000,000) (or AU equivalent) per incident. [NP]
- 12.2. The Organising Authority may request a copy of the Certificate of Currency
- 12.3. By completing the entry process the owner/skipper/guardian deems that the boat has the required insurance cover.

13. Media Rights [NP] [DP]

- 13.1. By participating in this event competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority, the Event Host and its sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the competitor during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 13.2. Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the Organising Authority or Event Host.
- 13.3. Competitors may be required for media interviews or press conferences at the regatta.
